



GETTING STARTED

Activities Ideas

A meetup is only as engaging and interesting as the activities on offer, and nano is no exception. If you're creating a nano meetup this document can help you in creating engaging activities designed to showcase nano and jumpstart interaction with your attendees.

Main Activities

Meet and Greet

One of the best things about a meetup is the open exchange of ideas with others who share a common interest.

Dev Talk

Have a dev come and speak in person or through a virtual meeting like Skype or Google Hangouts

Nano Hackathon

Host a hackathon for new services or tools utilizing Nano.

Trash Pickup for #NanoTrashTag

Help the environment while earning some Nano to split among the group.

Nano Hackathon

Host a hackathon for new services or tools utilizing Nano.

PubCrawl

Bonus points if you work with the bars to accept Nano, either permanently through a payment processor or temporarily (may have to open a tab and have people "buy" their beers through you or another host). A great way to demonstrate Nano to the public as a viable cryptocurrency for day-to-day transactions

Nano Stress Test

Each person gets the mobile address of 3-5 other attendees, and everyone sends as many small transactions to each other within a 3 minute timeframe. Display network stats on a screen for everyone to see their high score.

Stream an Activity

Stream your group doing something related to Nano, such as visiting a place that accepts Nano, or simply your meetup and discussion. You can also solicit donations to the stream or make an activity based on such donations from the stream!

Icebreakers

[“Who first heard”](#)

Go around the room introducing yourselves and your Nano "discovery" story.

[Nano Trivia Game](#)

Host asks the crowd a series of Nano centric questions, first to answer gets door prizes like Stickers, T-shirts, other swag and possibly some Nano.

[Pass the Nano](#)

Ask the young people to form a circle. Send the first person an amount of Nano and explain they need to pass this around the circle. Whoever holds the Nano should say a bit about themselves before passing it along.

[Nano Musical Chairs](#)

For n number of participants, there should be n-1 number of QR codes with seeds. The goal is to move the funds from the QR first. Whoever is without Nano in that round is out, and the process continues until there is only one winner.

[People Bingo](#)

People Bingo is one of the most popular ice breakers. The objective of this game is for people to wander around the room and to obtain the signatures of people who have the facts listed on the bingo sheet. Once a person successfully obtains a full row (5 in a row), whether horizontally, vertically, or diagonally, he or she shouts “BINGO!” and wins! This game requires a little bit of setup. Prepare a 5 by 5 table, with interesting facts written inside the boxes. These facts can include funny or bizarre things.
